President's report, February 2025

Hello members, Bryce Eishold here.

Welcome to the March edition of The Wobble Knocker!

The generosity of our members was highlighted again recently during the Healesville run after an impressive \$250 was raised for the Kangaroo Ground Fire Brigade.

It continually amazes me that members of our club are prepared to put their hands in their pocket and support community organisations like a local service or in this case, a fire brigade.



The run started at Donvale and finished with a pub lunch at the Terminus Hotel in Healesville - a full report on the event can be found in this edition of The Wobble Knocker.

More than 30 members in 21 cars took part in the run organised by Richard and Carole Simpson. The run was thoroughly enjoyable and expertly planned by the Simpsons who led the convoy at a sensible pace through some idyllic country roads.

Membership fee proposal

For the first time since the club was established, a modest membership fee increase will be proposed to the club's members at the annual general meeting on 19 July.

The committee will propose a \$10 increase to annual memberships. If adopted, it means the cost of a single membership will increase from \$30 to \$40 and family memberships from \$40 to \$50. This will help the club raise an additional \$1800 a year.

This is the first time the membership fee has increased since the club was founded 11 years ago in 2014.

The committee is committed to reinvesting funds raised through memberships back into its stakeholders - our members. This includes subsiding future runs, trophies for our annual show and shine, and venue hire fees for the AGM and Christmas lunch.

Importantly, these funds will also be used to protect the club and its members through three insurance policies that include public and products liability, associations liability and personal accident insurance.

From July 2025, the club will also become a member of the Association of Motoring Clubs, which supports and represents the likes of our club and drivers of classic vehicles.

If accepted by the members, the new cost of membership will come into effect in 2026/27, meaning membership fees will be unchanged for the 2025/26 financial year.

VicRoads renewals

Several members in our club have reported delays in receiving their Club Permit Scheme renewals in the mail.

Please ensure your registration dates are marked in your calendar to ensure the registration does not lapse. Once a registration expires, owners have 90 days to have the permit renewed to avoid having to re-register and re-roadworthy the vehicle. Don't get caught driving your vehicle if the permit has lapsed though, as you run the risk of being fined for driving an unregistered vehicle.

As of 28 February, the club has 177 cars registered through VicRoads' CPS scheme. I'm pleased to report membership remains steady with 181 memberships and 270 individual members.

Upcoming runs

Have you joined us on a car club run yet? If not, we'd love to see you!

The club has a series of runs in the coming months across metropolitan Melbourne and country Victoria. Locations include Dandenong and Mordialloc, Gisborne, Southbank and Williamstown, the Mornington Peninsula and Cranbourne and Inverloch. The club will also host a three-day, two-night trip to RACV's Goldfields Resort at Creswick in October. Details of all these runs are included in this edition of The Wobble Knocker.

The club's motto is *More members and more cars on more runs, more often*. Our car club runs typically attract anywhere from 20-50 people in a variety of classic and customised cars, and we'd love to see yours at an upcoming run.




Austin 3 Litres stun at British and European Classics Day

For quite a few years an old school friend and fellow car nut (Gary) and I have been travelling to Melbourne by air to attend the annual British and European car show in February.

It's a great car show featuring the cars that Gary and I am interested in. They usually have about 1,000 vehicles attending.

Now that I have the Austin 3 Litre pretty well sorted (are they ever finished?) I decided to book it on the car ferry (Spirit of Tasmania) and take it over to display at this event.



We drove to Devonport from Launceston on Friday 14th. Devonport is about one hour's drive. The ship was due to sail at 10pm, so it was an overnight journey.

After a good sleep we arrived at 8.30am in Geelong Victoria. Once we got the car off the ship, we travelled just a few kilometres to meet up with some friends for breakfast.

After breakfast we set off for Melbourne, about 1½ hours away. Fortunately, it being Saturday morning the traffic was not too bad. We were heading to a bayside suburb beyond Melbourne city. It's a bit daunting travelling on busy multilane roads in fast moving traffic in an old car and then negotiating our way through Melbourne. (I'm sure we can all relate to this wherever we live.) I was often thinking, "I hope we don't break down here, there's nowhere to pull over!"

On Sunday morning we headed off early for the 1½ hour drive to the car show venue at Yarra Glenn Racecourse. I parked up right next to the allotted spot for Austins, in fact right next to the 'Austin' sign.

I set the car up for display and headed off to check out all the cars. I have found in previous years that if you don't keep moving you can't see all the cars before they start to leave and head home.

I returned to my car about an hour later and had a BIG surprise. There parked beside me was another brown 3 Litre! I knew it was my friend Conrad's car but didn't know he was coming to the show as he has only recently got his car back on the road.

We had a good catch up and there was a lot of interest in our cars. So many people had never seen an Austin 3 Litre, let alone TWO!

Comparing cars side by side was interesting. Conrad's car is a British import and very original with original carpets and original woodwork all in very good condition.

My car has been fully restored and then recommissioned by me, so although in good order it could never be described as 'original'.

The day started with a little drizzle but then turned into a fine sunny day and a very agreeable 19 degrees (quite cool for Melbourne at this time of year).

After ogling all the display cars, it was time to travel the 1½ hours back to Melbourne.

The car performed faultlessly for the entire trip to and from Tasmania ... except for one thing. My hydraulic suspension decided to lose pressure. With the help of my friend Gary, I found an area where the nature strip was quite high in relation to the level of the road, and I put one side of the car up on the nature strip so I could crawl underneath and do a bleed procedure. I did this and the car pumped up again. I can only guess that it got an air lock.

The hydraulic rear suspension has never given me any trouble at all for about 12 months since I had the rams rebuilt.

Anyway, correct height was resumed, albeit leaning to port slightly but that could wait for fine tuning once I got home.



On the Wednesday we were booked for our return. Another 1 ½ hour drive back to Geelong to board the ship for another overnight trip.

While waiting in a queue to board we noticed a few Standard (Vanguard) and Triumph cars. I had a chat with a fellow in a 2000 PI and he told me they were a New South Wales car club going on a touring holiday to Tasmania.

Another sleep on board and when we woke up, we were coming back into Devonport.

The return trip was a bit rough and early in the morning we heard a big bang and the ship shook. I would say we may have hit a floating log ... or something. (???)

After another one-hour drive we were back home safely. We travelled a total of 364 miles or 585 kms and the car was 100% reliable and did not miss a beat - apart from that minor suspension issue.

All in all, a terrific adventure!

Roadworthiness requirements for club vehicles

A certificate of roadworthiness is required for all club vehicles manufactured on or after 1 January 1949, except street rod vehicles, light trailers and plant-based special purpose vehicles (e.g. tractor). Get a certificate of roadworthiness at a roadworthy tester.

It is optional for vehicles manufactured on or before 31 December 1948 to have a certificate of roadworthiness. The club scrutineer/official may inspect and declare the vehicle to be safe to use on the road.
