"I have previously served as their secretary before giving it away to focus on further study.


"I currently own five Hondas (most in storage) as well as two other Japanese vehicles."

Rubber suspension springs

Introduction

Morris Mini, 1100 and Austin 1800 vehicles made in Australia use rubber as the suspension springing medium. Even in hydrolastic suspension, there is a rubber spring inside the unit – the fluid just serves to act as a shock absorber (damper) and to transfer pressure to and from the front and rear displacers in an attempt to keep the vehicle level.

But, rubber being a somewhat natural substance, should be regarded as a perishable item just like tyres. Would you drive on 60-year-old tyres? Probably not, but you are probably OK with having 60-year-old rubber springs in your suspension. Perhaps it's time to have a look at them.

What's out there

To my knowledge, hydrolastic units are not available as new replacement items, but there are a couple of options when it comes to dry suspension. Rather confusingly, claims of "made to original specifications" appear to be hotly contested.

M-Parts Part No FAM3968 is sold by some vendors in Australia.

It is claimed that this is a "Genuine rubber cone spring made correctly from the original tooling and drawings from Dunlop and Rover." – a lengthy, somewhat spirited defence of the product follows (sadly let down by mis-spellings and poor grammar) in which it is stated that while theirs is the genuine item, competitor parts "If it has Alex Moulton or Avon VMS imprinted into the rubber it is not the original or genuine item as fitted to any production mini or factory aftersales unit ever. These aftermarket cones are UK made by Avon VMS owned by South Korean automotive supplier Dongah Tyre and Rubber? This Avon type also has the threaded

top plate as designed by Keith Calver and similar to our C-STR687/688 competition Mini Spares type which are only marked with." (sic)

Now, over to the competitor Avon, they claim: "To maintain the integrity and authenticity of the Genuine Moulton Rubber Cone Spring, the secret rubber formulas are exclusively retained by Avon under license from the Moulton Trust. This guarantees that the FAM3968 rubber cone spring, proudly bearing the inscription "DESIGNED BY ALEX MOULTON MADE BY AVON VMS ENGLAND," is the only truly Genuine rubber cone spring available in the market today."

The Avon springs have a threaded plate of which it is said "one notable improvement has been made. The smaller top plate no longer features the welded nut; instead, it has been upgraded to a threaded billet steel centre. This enhancement was personally devised by Dr Alex Moulton himself."

So there you have it. Two suppliers each claiming theirs is the genuine article and each using the same Part No FAM3968.

What the factory actually fitted

For dry rubber suspension, there are two part numbers – the earlier (1961) 2A4342 (which has a 9/16" UNF threaded nut on the bottom, and the later (1976) FAM3968 which has a 14M2 metric nut. In order to fit these parts, it is necessary to compress the spring using a special tool which has a thread at the end of a long rod that passes through the top of the unit.

If you are replacing original items, you will need both the imperial and the metric rods, one for removal, the other for fitting since replacement parts above only come with the metric thread.




Fig. 3 2A4142 (UNF thread)

The two springs are identical except for the nut.

It is interesting to compare these dry rubber cones with a hydrolastic unit. In the image below, I've tried to present the two different units to the same scale. Note differences in the rubber spring shape. The hydrolastic unit has an internal damper while the dry units have external conventional dampers (not shown).




Fig. 5 Rubber cone and Hydrolastic spring unit.

Conclusion


I decided to replace the original rubber cone springs on my 850 with the M-Parts units, and initially I was absolutely delighted. The suspension static height increased by about an inch. Going over bumps and potholes in the road was a delight with a pleasant rubbery thump felt inside the car instead of the usual bone-shattering jolt. However, it only took about 50 km for the new units to go back to square one and now I can hardly tell the difference.

So ... I am not so impressed. When the mood takes me again, I'll try the Avon parts (those with the 'secret' rubber formula) and see how they fare.

Roadworthiness requirements for club vehicles

A certificate of roadworthiness is required for all club vehicles manufactured on or after 1 January 1949, except street rod vehicles, light trailers and plant-based special purpose vehicles (e.g. tractor). Get a certificate of roadworthiness at a roadworthy tester.

It is optional for vehicles manufactured on or before 31 December 1948 to have a certificate of roadworthiness. The club scrutineer/official may inspect and declare the vehicle to be safe to use on the road.


